S-3 PERIODIC REPORT

No. 21

MAR: HAMILTON RIDGE, 1/20,000

1. LOCATION OF TOWNS: See overlay.

2. WEATHER AND VISTI: Very warm, heavy scattered cumulus clouds in mountain areas.

3. OUR POSITION:

a. Infantry:

- (1) 1st Bn.: "B" Co. consolidating on its newly won position (40.4-77.4), was receiving a great deal of sniper fire during the first part of the period and at 291600 had reported 1 KIA and 3 WIA from this source. However, the position was maintained. There was nil activity during the night 29-30. The bn. displaced forward to (40.4-76.9) reoccupying at 301400. Patrol activity forward and to the left flank occupied the bn. throughout the day. NC fire, thought to be 13 mm and barbwire, was encountered by "B" Co. patrols forward of its position. Two LMG's were found demolished. Sniper fire continued sporadically on "B" Co. throughout the day. Other patrols from "A" and "C" Cos. reported nil enemy contact.
- (2) 2d Bn.: "E" Co. found a demolished 37 mm field piece at (40.7-96.4) upon reaching that position at 291600. "E" Co. located a 7 m anti-aircraft gun and two M-1's during the security patrolling. There was nil activity during the night 29-30 throughout the bn. Extensive patrolling to the right of the bn. area during the day resulted in nil enemy contacts, however, several abandoned positions were located in that vicinity.
- (3) 3d Bn.: "F" Co. O.R. reported five enemy on ridge vicinity (39.1-97.3) at 291100 and artillery fire was called for. The results were not known. The bn. reported nil enemy activity during the night 29-30. An "F" Co. patrol received long-range R. MG fire from ridge vicinity (39.1-97.3) at 300900. All casualties to "F" Co. Artillery was placed on the ridge with unknown results. "F" and "G" Co. patrols reported nil contact or activity.

b. Artillery: The artillery fired five support missions during the period in addition to night 29-30 harassing fire. A supply detail on ridge enemy vicinity (39.1-96.6) at 291200; four were killed and one the wounded. An R. MG fired on four enemy vicinity in vicinity (39.5-9) the enemy were seen to strike and fall as a result of the fire but managed to crawl into the brush. These enemy are not included in or

- c. Engineers: Continued building the new supply route to "B" Co. position and maintained the present road.
4. RESULT OF OPERATION: The probing efforts of our patrols indicate the enemy is withdrawing his main forces as we advance, leaving small forces as we advance, leaving small dug-in delaying parties to delay the advance as much as possible. A few of these groups remain and fight to the death. Fire strung from strong points towards the rear indicate C.I. report our progress to rear parties who engage in long-range MG rifle and mortar fire as soon as possible as our artillery is brought to bear. Being deeply dug in on reverse slopes, our artillery apparently has little effect.

5. CASUALTIES:

a. Our casualties:

(1) For this period: 5 KIA, 20 WIA.

Total: 91 KIA, 250 WIA, 5 IIA.

b. Enemy Known Casualties

(1) For this period: 11 KIA, 1 IIA.

Total: 45 KIA, 1 IIA.
