- 2. WEATHER AND VISIBILITT: Cool, heavely overcast.
- 3. QUE OPERATIONS:
 - a. Infantry:
 - (1) Let Bn: Mil activity throughout night Oh-O5. "A" Co moved across MALACO RIVER to became BCT left flank protection and to patrol H side of the MALACO RIVER. The company had reached (39,6-OO.3) with mil contact or new evidence of enemy occupation at close of period. A "B" Co patrol along the heavily wooded draw (10.7-97.4) (39.7-99.9) reported mil contact or signs of provious occupation. No trails were found in this draw area. A "C" Co patrol to the H reported a freshly dug grave at (hl.3-98.4). Mattive fruit trees along the trail had been recently stripped of fruit. The patrol contact is ridge (hl.6-98.6). An "E" Op recco patrol followed the ridge line (11.0-97.1) S to (11.0-96.7) thence E to MALAGO KIVER at (11.5-96.7). No evidence other than ald bivouac at (11.0-96.5) was found of energy occupation. An "F" Go patrol towards the PATOD area reported a small evacuated bivouac and emplacements vicinity (10.2-96.3), a second evacuated bivouac vicinity (39.7-96.1). In this vicinity ware also found three large caves containing discarded womens clothing, one sack of rice, 5-25 1b boabs, a damaged knee mortar, 11 American Carbine clipe, 6 Jap gas masks and miscellaneous equipment. Continuing on mission the trail faded near (39.1-96.0), however, a trail near 185th Baf position was seen apparently leading into PATOG HULL area.
 - (3) 3d Bn: The "I" Co action in progress at Ohl500I ended with "I" Co holding its position without further opposition. Hil activity throughout Bn area night Oh-05. "H" Co moved to vicinity of (40.9-96.1) behind "I" Co thence W along ridge to (40.5-95.9). A dummy gun proporting to be a 75mm. and many abandoned positions were found

enroute, Mil contact. "I" Co moved forward to (41.5-95.9), the ridge from which all the 04 opposition had eminated. There was mil energy resistance during the movement. An elaborate defense system was found consisting of an elaborate network of connecttrenches, barbed wire, bunkers and for holes all showing evidence of very recent occupation, but no sign of the energy

b. Artillery: Harrassing fire during the night 04-05 and marking of two air strikes comprised the artillery activities.

, RESULTS OF OPERATIONS: There was no contact with the energy within the ROT sector throughout the day; the energy unaccountably having abandoned an elaborate defense system of bunkers, faxholes and trench net work. The strong positions stradelled our route of advance. As a result of this withdrawal, our forward elements advanced approximately hoo yde.
