3. OUR OFERATIONS:

- . Infantry:
 - (1) Let Bu: Nil activity during might 05-06. "A" Go, petrolling H of MALAGO RIVER (see overlay), reported mil contact. Old trails runming generally H and HE showed mil signs of recent travel. A "B" Go patrol through the TAIAP area to "A" Go position reported mil contact. A "G" Go patrol crossed MALAGO RIVER at (hi.4-97.7) reperted a fresh grave at (hi.6-97.9), an enemy position comprised af 12 to 15 emplacements at (hi.7-98.6) and one enemy sighted at (hi.8-98.3). The sighted enemy turned and ran back H along a faint tradie A second "O" Go recose patrol to (hi.0-97.8) reported me new syldence of enemy travel or proupation.
 - (2) 2d Ba: Ba patrol found one enemy dead (39.9-97.6) at 0516301. Insignia of 1st Lt. removed from cellar. Had evidently been dead several days. Mil activity throughout night 05-06. A "D" Co patrol to the PATOG HILL area (see overlay) reached recent enemy activity. Another "D" Co patrol last reported at (10.5-97.5). Transmission was peor but part of report pertained to enemy activity. No further report end of period. An "F" Co demolition detail closed six caves and one large bunker vicinity (39.7-96.3).

3d Bn: Hil activity throughout Bn night 05-06. "O" Ge displaced forward from 0505001 position to Bn area and moved with the advancing elements during 06. The entire Bn moved forward along the trail and adjoining ridges to the 3 for an advance of approximately 800 yds during the day. The advance was through unaccountably evacuated energy positions. These pesitions, if manned, would have very considerably held our forward progress to small gains. The familiar interlocking tunnels and network of transhes had been prepared all along the way. "H" Go, leading the push saw 6 or 8 energy in vicinity (hi.1-95.1). One energy was killed and several others known to have been wounced. One was taken prisoner.

- b. Artillery: Harrassing fire during might 05-06 and the marking of target vicinity (10.9-95.1) comprised the artillery's activity.
- c. Angeneers: The dry period gave the engineers an opportunity to improve and lengthen the supply road that had been churned to practically impassability during recent rain.

h. MESULTS OF OPERATIONS: Beconnaissance in the TATAP area gave no indication of recent energy operations; however, same indications of activity were found in the (h1.0-98.0) area. Operations forward pushed the RCT front elements south approximately 800 yds, through strong but evacuated chemy positions.
